



THE ST GEORGE'S POLICE TRUST –
For needy children of the police

The St George's Police Trust was founded in 2006 and resulted from the merger of the *St George's Fund* and the *Northern Police Orphans Trust*. Both the Fund and the Trust shared similar aims and objectives, and therefore a merger enabled the beneficiary base to be widened and costs to be reduced.

The St George's Police Trust is a registered charity (*Registered Charity No 220955*) supported by voluntary donations from service police officers in a number of police forces in England, Wales and Scotland.

The charity provides financial assistance to needy young people, one of whose parents is or was a serving police officer who contributed to the charity and is now deceased or wholly incapacitated from earning a living.

The Trust makes grants for support, maintenance, education and advancement in life up to school leaving age and, if appropriate, through a period of further education e.g. university. The eligibility criteria for receiving a grant or allowance is that the young person's parent is, or was, a police officer who donated to the charity whilst serving.
